The circumstances of this application involve the alleged medical malpractice committed against David Eckert by the aforementioned Doctors, which occurred on January 2 2013 to January 3, 2013. On January 2, 2013, Mr. Eckert was pulled over by police officers for allegedly running a stop sign. During

the traffic stop, the officers sought and received a search warrant to search Mr. Eckert for "up to and including his anal cavity." The officers took Mr. Eckert to Gila Medical Center in Silver City, New Mexico to execute the warrant. An x-ray was performed on Mr. Eckert where no foreign objects were found. Dr. Wilcox then performed a digital search of Mr. Eckert's rectum against Mr. Eckert's consent. Dr. Wilcox then ordered a surgical consultation with Dr. Odocha who also performed a digital search of Mr. Eckert's rectum. Neither doctor felt anything apart from stool in Mr. Eckert's rectum. Dr. Odocha then ordered enemas be performed on Mr. Eckert until he was "clear." Mr. Eckert was administered three enemas within four hours until nothing but fluid came out of Mr. Eckert. Then Dr. Odocha performed a colonoscopy on Mr. Eckert against his consent. The medical records indicate that Dr. Odocha used the warrant as a substitute for consent for the procedure. No foreign objects were ever found in Mr. Eckert.

Mr. Eckert alleges that the aforementioned conduct constitutes medical malpractice for lack of informed consent and for performing unnecessary medical procedures. Please find a copy of the filed Complaint for this case, the police report, the search warrant, medical releases, as well as the medical records which Mr. Eckert has in his possession.
